Then, the next morning in devotions, we were in desperate prayer for our brothers in West Africa, and the Lord really spoke clearly to us about His purpose in calling Stephen Apollos to be a spiritual helper for the

Corny's message said Stephen and his wife both had dreams of his going to be with the Lord in Africa, and apparently he had said in France just before he left that he was going back to Africa to die!

d been in the Family in South Africa and had a long-standing burden to return. I believe Livingstone had said something similar on his second and final trip to Africa.

The battle there is so much in the Spirit that our teams really need this extra helper! I had a vision of two hands descending from Heaven and placing a crown on Stephen's head—and his face shone like Stephen's in Acts 7! PTL!

PROPHECY received by Kenaz, the morning of January 9, 1978, while praying during morning devotions:

-THE SAD RESULTS OF UNANSWERED PLEAS!

Dearest Dad & Maria, 2 Feb. 78 I love you so very much and want to thank you first of all for all the Letters which you have been sending our way!

The reason I am writing you is because I have been so burdened about a certain situation in our Family regarding answering letters from little sheep around the world who write in after they have received the literature on the street. I would like to share an excerpt from a letter I received from a dear brother-in-bonds in Spain, with whom I have been corresponding:

"Recently both Keith and I have been through a depressing period, related entirely to the fact that our letters to Children of God colonies in England and Jerez, Spain have gone unanswered...We understand that your people are busy bees, winning souls, etc. for Jesus, but feel rather disappointed that our letters remain unanswered or acknowledged. I, especially, am disappointed in the lack of response from my home country, England. I'm still a mere baby in the Spirit and Family, so a little comfort will surely be advisable in the first days of my freedom. Also, can you send us some other Children of God colonies in this area for us to contact close to this prison? Love, Ian."

At the bottom of Ian's letter,

Keith, who is an American and has been a catacomber since last Nov-ember, writes that the unanswered letters have undoubtedly been an attack from the Enemy and asked if he could please continue to correspond regularly with me, as I have been the only one that has been answering their letters and requests for literature. This pitiful heartcry broke my heart, and of course I will be writing to them.

I just received another letter today and thought I'd enclose it as another sample of sheep not being able to get the new wine!

'We are not able to live in the colony but we are just disciples in the Spirit and really would like to suck from the new wine. Our local shepherd here doesn't give us all the Letters. We have literally to keep begging for them. Please send and keep us on your mailing list. It's nearly three months since I got any new Letters. We are still students, final year students studying to be doctors. Yours in Christ, Gabriel David; Kashmir, India." (Editor: If the local colony doesn't have enough copies, the least they can do is xerox some for these hungry souls!)

Often I receive letters to C.P. 748, Rome, requesting information and more literature and asking for an address near them to write to or

visit. My usual procedure is to answer the person writing in, sending also the requested literature and an address near him, after which I also write the address I have given them, asking the brethren there to please write or visit the person that wrote

It seems that very few even answer these sheep, sad to say, and as a result they continue to write to Their pitiful cries... that we read me, knowing that I will answer them. nearly break our hearts! - And we I now have a mailing list of over 60 people around the world, 30 of whom I write on a regular basis, answering their questions personally and really making them feel loved.

We now have three catacombers through this ministry, and one girl in America recently joined a colony there after corresponding with me for several months.

I am also corresponding with quite a few backsliders, former members of our Family who still want the Letters. I have received letters from these brothers and sisters, saying that writing to this address is their only hope because they have written to the colony where they used to be for lit and fellowship, but no one answers them. Many times when they do find a colony in the States, they are told that they don't have extra copies of the MO Letters and they can't even obtain the latest news from right where they are!

It just breaks my heart! Of course, I love to write letters and minister to these precious sheep. Yet, by doing this, I feel we are not really getting to the root of the problem:

That each colony should be responsible enough to answer a few letters from sheep! You have made it so

clear, Dad, how important our mail ministry is, in "Lovest Thou Me?", Letter no. 311A, paragraphs 56-66: .. We are personally responsible for their souls ...! How these are handled may determine their eternal fate at the most, and their friendship at the least!... You're going to have to face these souls in Eternity some day and give them an answer then! agonise in prayer that these pitiful pleas for help are being diligently answered by your offices!—Are they?
May God help you to take care of and feed His little sheep!"

Boy, those quotes really frighten me into being faithful to God's little ones, and I pray that in some way this letter may help make our Family feel more responsible to answer these little pleas for help in the mail. I would like to feel at peace and assured that when I forward a letter to a local field that it will be answered properly, instead of feeling like I do now, that I'd better do it all myself, otherwise these sheep will never be taken care of!

I know God will bless diligence and faithfulness in answering the mail with fruit and support and with a great satisfaction that through taking just half an hour to personally love up a sheep by letter, you were able to shed a little light in his heart and maybe even save his soul! PTL!
