Dearest Dad & Maria,

God bless you! We wanted to write about some general tendencies we saw in quite a few Homes. The Visiting Mother, Diamant's, comments after visiting several Homes touched on many problems and have helped to confirm many of the problems we saw when visiting the Homes.

The main thing we noticed is the fact that in many Homes people still don't take the Letters seriously enough and don't think they can live them, especially in the so important little ways. How we wish everyone in the whole Family would know that the King's house is not an "exception" but a sample of what it should be like in each Home!

In a way, many people have become numb to the circumstances they live in. Many, too, have the attitude that the RNR was only for the <u>leaders</u> who had done so much wrong, so they tend not to feel the <u>desperation</u> to change. It's much easier to blame everything on circumstance or the mistakes of <u>others</u>, rather than their <u>own</u> disobedience.

Others tend to think that what happened to them before the RNR was a "mistake", meaning "God made a mistake". They don't see that God let those things happen to accomplish something in their lives. So in some cases, bitterness crops up. People go from one extreme to the other—from enduring everything to now not being willing to accept lessons as applying to themselves.

In a way, it's understandable, but still it needs to change.

Here in our house, the head translator said something the other day that we felt brought to light another side of the problem a lot of the Homes are having: He commented how at the other Home he was in that they barely managed to read the MO Letters together and never read the "Davidito" Letters or "Family News" together. Even the MO Letters, he said, were just read but rarely discussed together. It was more just "doing their duty" in reading them.

It seems that so many Homes get so busy with everything they think they have to do that somehow they don't really take time to apply the Word, especially in the always-so-important little things in their own situations.

At the Home where the German VS's live, they (the VS's) were even actually accused by one member of their Home of "having too high standards" when trying to organise the schedule! It's almost like people get into a trap with self-imposed pressures of finances and day-to-day living, and they don't have the vision that the answers to all their, even daily, little problems are right in the Letters! They miss really "living" all those important spiritual principles and so many get bogged down with the cares of this life.

Some people at this time seem to be doing little more than just trying to "make it financially". So, they spend a whole day out litnessing and end up accomplishing only as much as they could have in just two hours, if they pressed in and made better use of their time!

You'd think every Home would have train, bus or tram schedules, so they could <u>plan</u> and not have to waste time waiting to make connections. But many Homes we've seen or heard of do not! (Editor: The Checklist-F2-includes a <u>bulletin board</u> for such helpful reasons as this!)

Also, it seems that people in the Homes don't realise how vital it is for each of them to accept their individual responsibility. It's taken some people a long time to "grow up" and take themselves more seriously and realise that they should be doing more to live the Letters.

Especially with the Home Servants, we've noticed that the trend is not that we're having dictators, but that the Servant is not taking the job seriously enough and is not being the "spiritual elder" or really "living" all the things Dad has to say about leadership in the Letters.

So most importantly, we have tried to get people to see that it is already written in the Letters and that their problems are all due to disobedience to what Dad has already written.

Another thing is that a lot of people have decided to make major moves on the spur of the moment, and in Northern Europe we have very few really well-established works as a result. Another sad result is that too often our parents lack the help they so desperately need with our children through this

We're happy to report, though, that the RNR has improved the Homes so much and people are learning! So many of these problems were hidden before and are now being brought out in the open to be solved. It is so encouraging that the vast, vast majority of the Family want to and do change. It seems like it's just a slow process for us all to grow and learn to be the leaders we'll need to be in the hard days to

disorganisation and everyone mov-

ing about so much (besides some

people just not being willing to

help!).

How much faster we could go, though, just by being more obedient. Lord help us! One thing we can see (as Dad has said) is that the VS's are a real key in this. So we want to really encourage them to keep going and not to compromise their convictions one inch but to keep reminding people to be real samples of the Letters.

Thank God for such a patient, loving Shepherd who feeds us so faithfully! We need you! With much, much love always—
