3. TIRES & BRAKES: Worn tires should be replaced without fail. On ice, snow or an unstable road shoulder they lose all grip,

Contrary to a popular myth, it is dangerous to slightly lower the pressure of the tires in order to better hold the road. Tips from Europe!

1. ANTI-FREEZE: It is imperative to take care of this before the real cold sets in, to avoid damilittle glycerine in the door locks, age to your motor. It's a good time to have your cooling system cleaned out. Usually protection down to -20° C. is sufficient.

2. BATTERY: Cold weather attacks your battery as it is sensitive to low temperatures. Check that the battery fluid is at the correct level, & that the amperage is at the maximum. Never

PARKING: If your car is going to be sitting outside for several days during cold weather, several days during cold weather, disconnect the battery & cover it with a thick cloth, or better yet take it inside. If the car is covered with snow, leave it there as the snow acts as a thermal cover. Just take it off before you leave. You can get ice off your windshield by pouring salt water on it, the salt lowering the freezing point.
