

## Winter Driving Tips!

Ten Helpful Hints for Peaceful Winter Driving!  
—Tips from Europe!

1. **ANTI-FREEZE:** It is imperative to take care of this before the real cold sets in, to avoid damage to your motor. It's a good time to have your cooling system cleaned out. Usually protection down to -20° C. is sufficient.

2. **BATTERY:** Cold weather attacks your battery as it is sensitive to low temperatures. Check that the battery fluid is at the correct level, & that the amperage is at the maximum. Never put anti-freeze in the battery.

3. **TIRES & BRAKES:** Worn tires should be replaced without fail. On ice, snow or an unstable road shoulder they lose all grip, producing the phenomenon of "aquaplaning". Inspect the brakes—bad adjustment can cause the car to fish-tail. Contrary to a popular myth, it is dangerous to slightly lower the pressure of the tires in order to better hold the road. Maintain the pressure advised by the manufacturer, or even better, add 200 gr. to each tire!

4. **RUBBER MOLDINGS & LOCKS:** Put talcum on the rubber moldings, which could stop

the doors from freezing. Never put oil on this rubber. Put a little glycerine in the door locks, inspect the different lights. Test the heating, the defrosting system, the state of the windshield wipers. Add alcohol or anti-freeze into the liquid for the windshield wipers.

5. **STARTING:** Don't warm up the vehicle while it is stationary, with the choke on full. An automobile is composed of various mechanical units whose movements are complementary. Start up & take to the road immediately, & after a few minutes let the choke back in to avoid premature damage to the motor. Don't go over 4000 rpm until the temperature of the motor is at 80° C.

6. **DRIVING:** On icy roads the braking time is multiplied by 3-5 times the normal distance. Increase the distance between you & the car in front. Never brake suddenly, & avoid having your wheels locked. Drive in an aware manner.

7. **ACCELERATING:** If you try to start off in first gear on

an icy road, the drive wheels turn too fast & spin. In second, however, the power transmitted is weaker & starting is easier. For the same reason it is better to get into third or fourth gear as soon as possible.

8. **STUDDED TIRES:** Four studded tires are the best equipment. If you only have two, put them on the drive wheels. Break in your new studded tires by driving the first 100 km. at no more than 70 kph.

9. **CHAINS:** Imperative for going over snowy mountain passes. Only put them on when you reach the immediate area & take them off afterwards, as driving on a dry road with them on can damage the axles.

10. **PARKING:** If your car is going to be sitting outside for several days during cold weather, disconnect the battery & cover it with a thick cloth, or better yet take it inside. If the car is covered with snow, leave it there as the snow acts as a thermal cover. Just take it off before you leave. You can get ice off your windshield by pouring salt water on it, the salt lowering the freezing point.

### MORE WINTER DRIVING TIPS!

(From a U.S. Gov't. pamphlet, "Winter Survival" from the Dept. of Energy.)

**KEEP YOUR GASOLINE TANK AS NEARLY FULL AS POSSIBLE.** This will minimize water in the tank & will provide the maximum advantage in case of trouble.

**CARRY A WINTER STORM CAR KIT.** It should contain: \*Sleeping bags, or 2 or more blankets. A stack of newspapers can provide layers of insulation & make a good substitute. \*Two empty 3-lb. coffee cans

with lids. One may be used for sanitary facilities, the other to burn candles for heat. Use a catalytic heater if available. A catalytic heater relies on a chemical reaction to produce heat. (Whether using this type of emergency heat source or your car's own heater, be sure to leave a window open for air circulation. Carbon monoxide poisoning can happen without the victim being aware of it until it's too late.) \*Matches & candles. \*Winter clothing, including wool caps, mittens & overshoes. \*Large box of facial tissues. \*First aid kit with pocket knife. \*Flash-
