

As the ship's horn blows to sound the departure, she prays with them to receive Jesus. As she watches them hurry off to the ship she shouts, "I'm coming with you!" & runs after them to get aboard the only ship on the sea that saves!

ONCE OUT ON THE OPEN SEA, Angelo & Sarah sing their beautiful song "Navighero" as the sun begins to set. (We were able to get some good night-time shots with the use of a lens filter.)

The storm mounts & "The Waves Roar" sings Jeremy, speaking symbolically of the peoples & activities of the World in their wars & riots & terrorism, the World like the troubled sea when it cannot rest. 
The storm scene! To Phoebe's frantic question, "What are we going to do?" Simon comforts here, "We're going to have to trust the Lord!"
