THE EXPLOSION OF '82!
-The Future of the KIngdan in 19831

1. USUALLY SOME TIME AFTER RECEIVING THE LAST STATS OF THE YEAR I GIVE A YEAR-END REPORT ON THE STATE OF THE NATION \& THE EAMILY according to the statistics received In our year-end stats, \& I have found some very interesting \& encouraging things, as well as a few puzziling things, \& a fer things which I thilik need attention.
2. THPE ARE SOME THINSS TO CPOW ABOUT A BIT \& BE THWKFUL FOR, how the Lord has blessed us! Probably the greatest advance of the past year regarding the numbers reached \& menbers added to the Family has been that In the fleld of Radio \& Music Club Menbers which we have recently added to our total World stats \& population \& Hores, which has caused our Populat lon \& Home stats to skyrocket phenomenallyl-Showing how mary thour sands of new young people, principally young people, we're reaching via our major radio programs-particular ly MMM \& MCV, as well as many others in a total of about 10 or a dozen languages nhom we have galned through over a thousand radio stations reaching most of the countries of the world!
3. IN ONLY TWO YEARS OUR FIRST INTERMATIONG SHOW. MUSIC WITH MEANING INTEPNATIONW. HAS GRON FROM ABOUT 72 TO OVER 700 STATIONS IN 70 COUNTRIES. AND FROM ABOUT

1400 MEMERS TO ABOUT 7.000 ! They have dis tr lbuted nearly 20,000 tapes to those sta tions, having alred over 40,000 shows to date. That's quite a reaping through just one radio show! PTLI
4. MCV HAS HAD AN EVEN MDPE PMENOMENL PECENT GOWTH, most of its push being just within the past year, with again over 700 statlons bocked just this past year, in 30 countr les with nearly 10,000 hours of pro graming, which has reaped nearly 10,000 members in 43 countrles! They have produced \& distributed about 25,000 tapes \& printed over half-a-million pleces of IIt, as well as hand ing nearly 25,000 pleces of mail. MMM In Its two past years has handled a total of over 150,000 pleces of mall, Including tapes, letters, lit etc. So that's our phenomenal growth in radio \& Music Club nembers.
5. BUT OF COURSE THIS HAS RESUTTED IN A AHENOMENL GOOTTH IN OUR OVERAL MEMEFSSHIP. an increase in the past two years with the addition of these Radio Members of nearly 20,000 additional members in only two years, to a grand world total today of the begirning of 1983, of nearly 30,000 Famlly Manbers in over 100 countries troughout the worldl-lll acoording to the January ist stats, to be exact, Ilving In over 20,000 Hones with 30,000 Mambers! This boost in our
outreach, ooverage, menbership \& Homes came Just in time. Although we have reached at the end of 1982, this past year, a phenomanal top total of about 10,000 ififing Mant bers, these now constltufe only bbout onetird of ar total population-approximately 10,000 Iffers \& 20,000 Radio Members in o total of about 20,000 Homes.
6. HOWEVER. AOCORDING TO THE LATEST STATS, WE HAVE HAD A VERY SLIGTT DEQ INE IN THE AST HALF OF ' 82 OF SOMEAHERE AROUN AP PRCXIMATELY 200 TRF MEMEERS, which is pOss lbly under standable due to a number of fac-tors-a great deal of moving \& reshuffiling about, \& same may have gotten lost samewher in the shuffle, as well as the recessionbut somewhere over 2200 TRF Homes in the middle of ' 81 have decilined In the past' year-s-a-half to only a little over 1700 TRF iomes.
7. THIS COUD BE AOCOUNTAELE TO THE FACT THAT MANY SINGES \& COUPLES HAVE JOINED do not seem to be complever, our cooqp stats do not seem to be complete, showing a very slight gain of not more than 100 hones, up to around 600 now from approximately 500 two years ago. This oartainly would not account for the loss of 500 Homes in the past year s-arhalf, \& since we have lost not more than about 200 TRF Menbers in the past half-year this also cartalnly could not account for the loss of 500 Homes in the past year-s-ahalf.
8. SO I THINK WE'RE RUNNING INTO SOE KIND OF DIFFIOULTY ON OR STAT-KEEPING, OR OR DEFINITION OF CO-OPS \& VARICUS KINDS OF HOMES. Only 200 people have disappeared, but about 500 homes have vanished! And even If every single one of those 200 represented one Individual private Home, they stlll would have only accounted for a loss of 200 Homes. So where did the other 300 Homes go? Well, since our total TRF Menbership has not deci lined that much, there must be a dlscrepancy somewhere in the description or the definition of Hones, because since we've only lost 200 pecole, the only place these folks could have disappeared would be into ther Homes. Even If every ane of the 200 lost represented a Home, the other 300 Hame are unaccounted for, \& the only place they could have been lost without a fur ther loss in population mould have been into other In population would have been
9. SO I THINK SOMEHOW OR ANOTHER WE'RE NO 9. SO I THINK SOMEHON OR ANOTHER WE'RE NO
CATCHING AU. THE FIGRES wich we need to CATCHING AL. TE FIGURES which we need to
record \& $1 t^{\prime}$ 's elther you folks who on your actual TRF do not report new members who may have formerly had have jolned yours, or you cpos are elther not counting the number of Hores acar ately 210
or not counting the number of Co-ops acar rately. Because 300 Individual Hones could hardly have disappeared into an Increase of only 100 Co-ops-although there is a possiblility there it several of these 300-500 missing Homes formed fairly large Corops of several families each, \& this has happened In some cases.
10. BUT TO MAE SURE WE KNOW EXACTLY WHAT QUR HOMES CONSIST OF \& GET OR DEFINITIONS EVEN MCH MOPE ACARATE regarding the types of Hones, I'm going to suggest that we ert large our definitions of the types of Homes fram only 3 ar 4 k Inds now IIsted, to about 6 or 7 kinds. For example, Trf Hones are Single families \& Individual Homes. These terms are a $11+t 1 e$ mi sleading \& vague, i belleve, because "single" sounds like a single person. But so far we have meant by single Forily tores a meted havele th or without chil And the Indluidual H ores sound like then. Nid the individual homes sound ike they could be individual Homes with families, but they actual ly mean one single adult with or without children. The Co-ops have been def ined as more than Just one couple \& chli Idren Iliving together, or several singles IIving together.
11. SO TO MAKE THES DEFINITIONS MCH MDRE EXACT, we're golng to request that your statisticions define the homes mare clearly hereafter. Im talking ooout IIf Homes now, we al so have LIN Homes \& the Music Club Homes, or Radlo Hones. I think it would be almost even better, perhaps, to define them as Radio Homes, which gives us a clearer ancept of how we are reaching them. So would like to see the TRF Homes themselves divided into the following six calegor les: 12. FROM NOW ON A SINGE HONE WILI MEAN A HOME OF JUST ONE AOUT, NO MORE, NO LESS, GE ADU T WITHOUT CHILLREN. That WIII mean a Single Hane. A Single Family Home wIII mean one adult with one or more chllaten. A
Couple Hame wIII mean a Hone of two adults \& no chlldren. A Couple Famlly Home will be a home of two adults with one ar more children. A Oo-ap Home will mean a Home of three or more $\frac{a d u l t s ~ w i t h ~ n o ~ c h i l d r e n, ~ w h e r e a s ~ a ~}{\text { a }}$ co-on Family Home will mean a Home of three or more adults with one or more chillten
13. IN OTHER WOPOS TE TEPM FAMIY HO WIL BE APP IED QNY TO THOSE WIIH CHIDRAN whereas a single will mean one adult, a couple will be two adults, a Corop will be three or more adults. A single Fanlly Hame will mean one adult with one or more chilldren. A couple Family Home will mean two cren. A couple family home will mean two ap Family Home wlll mean three or more 0 ap Family Home will mean three or more 110 adults with one or more chllaten.
14. I HOFE THAT IS QEAR 90 we can more learly define these types of Hares \& see what is happening in each case according to our stats, \& when there are changes, in creases or decilines, we can know exactly what type of tane these changes are cocur ring in \& perhaps figure out why. And thus when there is a strange deciline of only a eer In population \& yet hundreds of Hones. erheps cen find out where they uent
15. I'M CONINCED THAT SINCE OP POPL TIO CF TPFers HAS REMAINED NO FAIPIY STAQLE at somewhere close to $10,000 \mathrm{TPF}$ ing Home Manbers, that the decline in the number f Hores over the past year-t-ahalf has Hones over the past year-z-r-half has boen the result pat hose single anllies in Individual Hanes dlsappearing into Co-aps, as there has been a considerable decil ine in the same perlod of time of at least a couple hundred single Famillies couple hundred Indlvidual Hones, which would probably account for the decrease in the number of Homes without much of a decrease in the total population.
16. HOWEVER, SINCE THE OO-CP HOMES ARE NOT REGISTERED AS HAVING INCREASED THIS FQUR CR IVE HWNORED, but staying at about the same evel or not much more-haven't Increased ore than soout 100, somewhere around five to 600 00-ops-this must meon that these coops, though not increasing in number of ceops, are increasing in population. In other words, the Co-cops are growing in size as they absorb these Single \& Individual homes, as they have been called. And l believe this is where these former Homes have disapeared, into co-aps of varying sizes, a number of them consisting of meny more than three adults \& many chlldren. In fact, we have sone that are again now Hones running as high as $25-50$ people, 25 adults, 25 children.
17. THESE CO-OPS \& COMBOS HAVE BEEN GRONING PHENOMENNLY DURING THE PAST COLPLE EARS AS MDFE OF YOU HAVE GONE TO THE MISION FIED, \& in so doing you cooperated ith other's in a place to Ilive. This would acoount for the fact that though our actual iffer population has remained fairly stable at around 10,000, ar total number of Hones as decreased by 4 or 500 , who elther have gone together in more co-ops or existing coops. The decrease in the number of total tomes has not necessarily Increased the nunber of Co-aps in the same ratio, because a number of Single \& Individual homes hove cooperated together In one single $00^{-} 0 p, 50$ that the actual increase in the number of co-ops has only been about a hundred. Where as the decrease in the number of Individual $\&$ Single Hones has been 4 or 500 .
8. -WHICH SOUNOS TO ME LIKE IE oO-SS ARE GROWING, \& obviously the Single \& Individual Hanes are decreasing \& goling together more in the large co-ops \& Canbos \& larger Family Homes-which now we consider better \& stronger types of Homes, particularly for the foreign mission flelds into which many of you have gone \& where it is more difficult to survive Individually \& minister Individually \& alone, whereas it is much more easy to survive cocoeratively \& to more easy to survive cond
minister cooperatively.
19. EVEN IF A NMEER IN THE HOME CANNOT EVEN PPEAK THE LANGUACE OF THE FIED. THEY CAN WOFK IN JOBS INSIDE THE HOME such as housakeeping, caoking, mal itenance, chil $\alpha-$ care \& lively within the Mork. beling done cooper at vely witr she bep. Wher eas those who know the country s the people \& the language s the witnessing can get out s devote their fulltime now to witnessing \& Iltnessing outside amongst the pecple while the others keep the homefires burning. Sone soldlers can stay home \& stand by the stuff wille those others go forth to battle as already trained \& exper lenced soldiers in that fleld.
20. AS THE LORD SAYS HIMSELF IN HIS WORD, AS DAVID OPDERED HIS ARMY, HE SAID TTHEY THAT STAD BY TIE STUFF"- in other words, stay hane \& take care of the kids \& the house \& malntenance \& all the jobs that can be done \& need to be done within the hame as ell as feeding the whole tribe \& the soldlers that go out to battle-King David sald by the inspiration \& anointing \& wisdam of the Lord in I Samuel 30:24, that those who stayed home by the stuft would receive their share equally with those who went forth to the battle.
21. IN OTHER WOROS, HE CONSIDERED THE HQNE-KEEPERS WHO STAYED AT HOME \& OPERATED THE HOME, STOOD BY THE STUFF, JUST AS IM PORTANT \& valuable \& worthy of compensation \& sharing in the fruit \& the profits of the hone, as those who actually went out into the battle. Because what could the soldiers do without logistics, \& wat armil is it that doesn't travel on it's stanach? what home can hats stana? illine can urvive without hat ineops \& chlikeepers \& cooks \& housekeepers \& maintenanoe men, repairmen \& school teachers, all of the veriaus jobs which must be done of home \& 1 thin the hame?
22. EVEN THOUGH THOSE PECPE MAY NOT BE AQLE TO SPEAK THE LOCA LANGWGE OR KNOW LCH ABOUT LOCAL WITNESSING \& may not be in some respects as good witnesses or 11 thes sers because of thelr lack of knowledge of the language, they can be very valuable as Hone members in taking care of the home \&
the cooking \& the housekeeping \& the children \& the teaching, maintenance \& all the rest to set the experienced witnessers, Iltnessers \& those familiar with the larguage free to go forth to the battie \& devote their full time to It, while the others stand by the stuff \& take care of the hare base.
23. THIS HAS PROVEN EXTREMELY SUCCESSFI N DAYS GONE BY, IN FACT MANY YEARS GORE BY his is the way we started, this is the way e survived-exceept that during a cartal perlod our Homes grew too large, some of then with as high as two \& three hundred ambers, which made them top heavy \& unileldy \& ungainly \& expensive \& with too many cooks spoliling the broth \& too mary chiefs \& not enough Indians, so that we also were conflined to too few lacations \& not spreading out into the fleld. We were not really getting the job done \& going into al the world to preach the Gospel to every reature.
24. SO WE BEGAN E.OB-BUSTING, trying to break up these huge ungainly \& ridiculcusly encrmous blobs of hundreds of menbers in one single Home, one single address, one single alther huge offlice bullding, hotel, apart ment house or whatever, \& scattering them out in smaller Family Units throu hout the world. And this has succoeded in spreading out our Fanilly \& our Ministry Into many much incre needy fields \& freeing many for much more actlive fleld service throughout many rore countrles, so that we have grom from just one country, originally the United States, to over 100 countries throughout the iorld, \& from only about 50 Homes during the irst year to now over 20,000 Homes. And from only about 500 to 2,000 Members or so during those first couple years, now to bout 30,000.
25. L WOUD SAY THAT TE ELOB-OUSTING DID US A LOT CF GOCO! it scattered us so that went into more countrles, more flelds, reaped more harvests, got more disciples \& as a result we Increased in both homes Members \& fields \& fruit \& souls savedl But for awhlle there almost ment to the op posi te extreme of too small Homes with too fer people, so that the one couple with several children could not accompl ish very wuch except to take care of their own hane ittle family $\&$ kids \& all of its various duties, as well as earning a living, \& at the same time trying to witness \& IItness \& in souls, which was very difficult
26. WHEREAS NOW THAT WE ARE STRIKING A MRE HAPPY MEDIUM \& forming more corops \& Canbos, same are able to stay hame \& devote their fulltime to "standing by the stuff" \&
taking care of the kids \& the Hone \& the meals \& the maintenance \& keeping the home Ires burning, wille others are relleved \& released fram most of these duties to be ree to get out into the battlefleld \& wit ness \& ilitness fullitime, particula aly those tho are more fanillar with the country \& the ho s the language SO THIS Hasuage.
27. SO THIS HAS NOW WOFFED OUT VERY PRCFITAGIY FOR THESE OOOFERATIVE HOMES ON THE rariaus duties for various Far a designate arious duties for various Fanily Menbers ith their increased population in the Home, so that some can stand by the stuff while others 90 forth to the battle. But they shall recelve equally as far as the Lord's concerned in both care \& respect \& appreciation, as well as their share in what is being accamplished in the fleld, \& certainly 111 be rewarded by the Lord equally accord ingly. He says so in his word s there you have King David's ann word for it, surely inspired by the Lard, That they wilch stand by the stuft shall recelve equally with the wo go forth to the battle.
28. GUT A HOME MUST HAVE SUFFICIENT MDM ERS THAT THERE ARE ENOUGH TO STAND BY THE TLFF \& ENCUGH TO BE FREED FCR THE BATLLE t's pretty difflcult when there's only one couple with some children \& you expect one dear $11 t+1$ e woman to do all the housenork, all the cooking, all the childcare all the teaching \& ali the maintenance while the oach is put in the flald trying to witness Itness 1 minister as a missionary as wil as earn a living. It's a little hard on both as earn
29. SO MEDIUN-SIZED CO-QPS AEE VERY ADVANAGEOS: -Not the gigantic manstrosities, he horr ible blabs of hundreds of members hich we used to have-but I would say that co-ops consisting of certainly two or more couples with their children are very advantageous when there are four or flive or six adults who can have a number of different esponsibilities, plus perhaps an equal or reater number of chllaren.
30. THE WOFK CAN BE SPREAD AROUND MOFE EVENLY \& MANY HANDS MAKE LIGTT WOFK! Those ho are talented in home care \& chlld care aintenance, even provisioning perhaps, can specialise in these fleids, while those who are talented in witnessing, il thessing, Fing \& the language can specialise in the actual missionary work \& invading the fleld s reaping the harvest-not forgetting that the other's who have to stay at hane to take care of the stuft \& the kids deserve Just as much credit as those who have gone into the fleld \& witnessed, I itnessed \& inn souls The folks at home will shere in those souls
\& God will give them just as much credit for them as those who go out \& witness to them, ilmess \& win them. That's God's fairness equality of sharing, in both the responsibillties, obligations \& the burdens, as well as in the rewards.
31. SO PRAISE THE LORD. I THINK THAT ABOUT COVERS OR STATS OF OR HOMES, of first all our TPF Hones \& their members, \& our radio shows \& their members, \& we are thereby urging you urgently to form more Cooperative Homes, which we belleve are better sulted for both ministry \& survival \& support on the field. In this way more income can be generated \& shared mare equitably as well. Sone may have better home support than
others, some might even get local jobs, some may be fFers, some may be good provlsloners, \& there is a much higher percontage of possiblility of succoss when there are more pecple to share more responsibilities \& more support \& more of the work in more different types of work \& flelds than when there are so few.
32. IF THERE'S ONLY ONE COUPL \& A FEW SMALL OHILRREN, perhaps nelther one of them has much home support, \& maybe nel ther one of them are frers or good at provisioning, yet they may be excellent at childcare \& mechanical maintenance or teaching or home care, cooking etc. Nevertheless, If they don't have sufficlent support through the various supporters, thelr talents can be lost \& burled, talents which they do have \& which are just as valuable contributions to the Home as monetary support.
33. SO I URGE YOU TO FCPM BETIER COOFERATIVES WITH MAFE VARIED TALENIED TEAMS, $\&$ as you recall long ago, we highly recommended that an Ideal Home consist of perhaps a half-a-dozen to a dozen adults with perhaps half-a-dozen to a dozen chlldren-in which case they're bound to have sufficiently varied talents \& ablilities to care for all of the varlous needs of that home, both inside \& aut, as mell as its ministry \& support etc.
34. SO PLEASE BY AL MEANS TRY TO FOFM WELL-ROUNDED CO-CPS \& COMEOS containing tea members with all the various talents that you need, talented in the various supportrs, as well as the various ministries, including the ministries within the Homeoocking, cleaning, housecleaning, honecare, housework, chl ldcare, teaching, repairing, maintenance, transportation-many many very important \& vital \& necossary ministries which can be performed by some of the fanlly Ithin the Hone, even if they are ignorant of the language \& the people \& the methods of ministry in that particular fleld.
35. HEREAS THE EXPERIENCED BATTLEFRON SODIERS CAN THEN THERFORE Q $Q$ INTO THE BATLEFIELD \& fight the battle faoe-to face with the Enemy s do the experienced wi thess ing that is necessary, litnessing \& soulwinning ministry so vital to the fruits needed to be gained in that particular field, \& the withess needed to be made faithfully in that particular place. 36. YOU DON'T WANT TO BECOME TOO MMMEROUS TOO TOP-HEAVY \& TOO MAKY IN THE HOME, \& aS we've suggested before, a total of a dozen to two dozen people is more or less ideal, with from 6 to 12 adults $\& 6$ to 12 chlil ren. In such a Home with that many there are In such a Hone with that many there are bound to be a number of varied talents, 8 in choosing your Home members \& forming your corias a canbos, I highly recommend that you seriqusly consider the various talents of the individual Home Manbers \& organise your Hone accordingly, \& recelive new Home Member recrults accordingly as you have need of cortain talents $\&$ ministr les you may be lacking, \& look for those who minister in oertain fields which you may not have in your partlalar Hone.
37. YOU CAN'T ALL NECESSARILY BE FF 'ERS, I though we do have some FF Homes who do that almost exclusively with very good support \& with a very good wi mess, but even they usually have to have a few men around to take care of the house o the maintenance a provisioning sometimes, \& somebody has to stay home with the chiliren to teach \& cock s clean etc. So there are al ways places of ministry for those who do the simple \& seemingily more lowly, but just as vital \& just as necessary \& just as needed ministrles ithin the Home, as well as the exterior ministries in the field. So try to round out your hone.
38. WE USED TO EVEN DESIGNATE THE TMFES OF NDIVIDWLS WHICH SHOUD FORM A TEM, if you NDIVIDUKLS WHICH SHOUD FORM A TEM, If you Nos. 59 \& 62), that each tean or Hore, molle hare, moblle tean, should have at least one or two good leaders who are experienced in getting along with pecple \& eading \& shepherding, organising, getting folks to cooperate \& work together, managing \& good at administration \& business, or ganisation etc., a good leader, good shepherd \& his wi fe probably. Or perhaps she's the one who is best at that \& he's perhaps better at maybe even ooking or housekeeping or taking care of the klds. So each tean or Home should have good leadership.
39. NDD THEN, OF CORSE, IF POSSIBLE, AS WE POINTED OUT, EACH ONE NEEDED AT LEAST ONE 6000 INSPIRATIONAL IST, preferably an Instrum mental ist who could play \& sing \& lead the
hane in Inspiration \& fellowship \& olso be valuable in the fleld in busking \& witness Ing etc. Each Home also needs someone who is a good secretary, who If possible can type ir ite reports \& carry on carrespondence.
take care of the mall ministry \& the hame support \& writing prayer letters \& all the various dutles that are necessary secretarlly in every home. Sometimes the wife of the shepherd has these talents, or some other individual, boy or girl within the Home. 40. SQEEIMES THE SHEPERD HIMSEF IS TALENTED ALONG THESE LINES, AT TYPING-I WAS! I typed, I wrote my onn Prayer Letters \& I kept up a Mall Minlstry \& got Hore Support \& supported my ilttle family that way for many years. Whereas my wite did ven way for mary years. Whereas my wite did very \& chilidcare \& teaching \& even leading the ilttle team of children aut into the field in witnessing \& IItnessing \& busking.

41. MY MINISTRY WAS ACTUNLIY MOPE IN THE HOE IN THOSE DAYS, teaching the chiliaren \& wIting the letters \& doing the typing \& publiclsing \& ralsing support by mall. I would soy that most of my ministry s more of it was within the home than It was on the outside. Whereas her ministry with the children was outside in the fleld in witnessing, IItnessing, busking, soul-wining \& all the rest.
42. SO BOYS, DON'T FEEL LEFT OUT IF THE WIFE \& KIDS SEEM TO BE MORE IN DEMAND \& MOFE TALENIED IN THE PUELIC MINISTRY THWN YOU ARE you seem to be left at hame alone a good deal while she's elther doling that or fFing good inspir her talent may be. Maybe she's good inspirational ist, instrumentalist, sin that may be, \& she's out busy in the publlc that may be, \& she's out busy In the plolic ministry while you're lett at hane to take care of the baby the car s maybe even the cooking \& the housterepling washing dishes the offlice \& the correspondence \& raising the offlce \& the corresp

43. SO DON'T FEEL TOO BAD, I'VE BEEN IN
