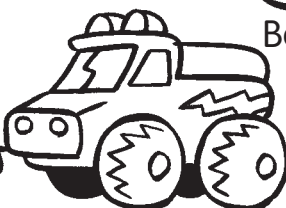

What's wrong with pride, Tim?

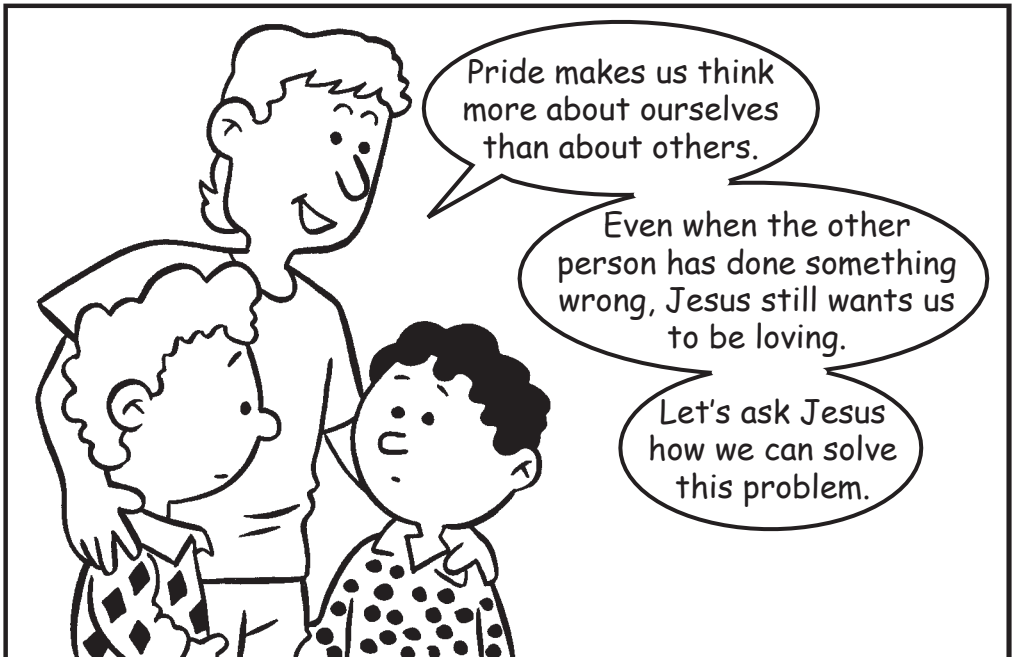
It makes others sad.

Because it stops us from being loving.

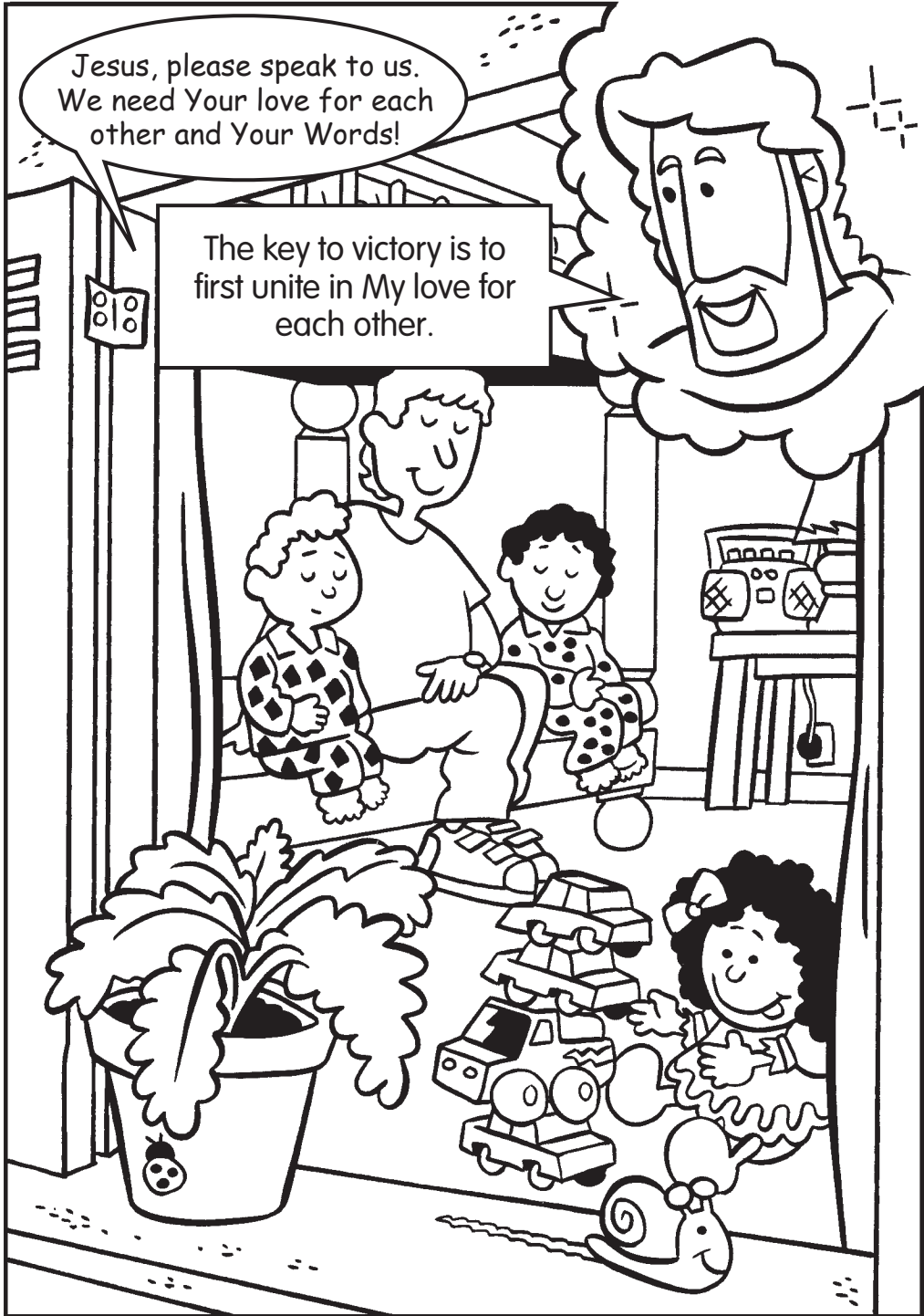
That's right!
