peace once again.

6. IT WAS A GOOD SIGN THAT HE'D GOTTEN OVER THIS FEAR OF THE DARK when only 2 nights later, when we thought he was already asleep in bed, we found all the kitchen & hallway lights were ablaze, leading all the way to our downstairs bedroom! -- And there sat Dito on our bed, chomping an apple! "I was looking for you all over the house", he

said, "but I couldn't find you, so I got a snack & came back to bed!"

7. DITO SOON OVERCAME THESE BREATH-HOLDING FAINTING SPELLS, thank the Lord, with God's strengthening Word & prayer power. Even though many "common" childhood behaviour problems can be rationalised & labeled according to counsel in the Baby Books etc., we as God's Children can not simply "accent" any problem in our children's lives.

8. IT SEEMED TO BE SOME SORT OF FEAR that caused poor Little David to cry 'til he passed out at these times of frustration or injury--it was not simply a physical problem or normal behaviour -- & it was only the perfect Love of the Word & God's Spirit that cast out that fear! (I John 4:8.)

9. RECOMMENDABLE BABY BOOKS DO AGREE THAT "BREATH-HOLDING ATTACKS" ARE A REACTION TO FRUSTRATION, usually in toddlers who are very bright children. But whatever means they suggest to treat it are ineffective if the cause is not prevented & omitted. Once again, Love never fails, & certainly remedied this problem of crying, fearful reactions to Dito's head injuries or frustra-

tion, PTL!

10. WHILE READING A BOOK ABOUT GYPSIES, Dito pointed out the gypsy woman who told fortunes & said, "I see something mysterious about this gypsy woman" I explained to him that she had a dark spirit -- she probably didn't know Jesus & that's why she looked sort of dark & wicked. "Aha!", he answered, "That's it!"

14. SCHOOLTIME HIS EDUCATION MOSTLY STEMS FROM THE THINGS HE IS INTERESTED IN READING ABOUT, so besides what he reads in books daily, schooltime is usually a concentrated study on writing, math, science, or geography & sometimes an art project. In the month of January he had 12 days of these specified school lessons, plus read at least one book a day. He learned ten new verses by memory & had a daily Bible Study in flannelgraph (usually the study of a Bible man, miracles, etc.), as well as a MO Letter daily.

These special studies on certain countries & customs usually last about two

school periods. 17. WHEN DISCUSSING ANIMALS OF THE DESERT Dito kept asking, "Does that animal bite? Does he kill other baby animals?" Of course Nature takes its course in life, so I told him what animals attack others, etc. But soon he began deriving his own little gorystories about the fox stealing & eating baby birds, etc. So I told him I did not like to hear those stories he made up if they were not about life & love & joy. then began to make up stories about each of the pictured animal family & how they make love, have babies, search for food together, etc.:
