in the morning for Spanish words, multiplication tables, Scripture memory verses, books of the Bible, Grandpa Quotes, etc. Of course making the poster look very nice & attractive using different colours & very bold letters in print helps makes the learning even more easy & enjoyable & helps the child to see clearly and not have to strain or become disinterested in attempting to read it, & so he can even see it without much effort.

27. DAVID & DAVIDA BOTH HAD A BIG INTER-EST IN PLAYING SHOP & MAKING CHANGE DUR-ING THIS TIME, so every time there was a period of space where we didn't have some other project directly lined up then & there, the kids started setting up shop! -- Sometimes I think sweet staff cook Jewel must have the patience of a saint when the kids invade her kitchen cupboards!

28. ONE FUN EVENING WHILE THE OTHER WERE OUT FOR A MOVIE, THE KIDS LOADED THE ENTIRE BREAKFAST ROOM TABLE with all sorts of cans & foods while I was doing dishes, so there I was expected to continue the shop game while they were writing out their price cards on slips of old paper. I quickly ran to the bed-

29. "COWBOY NIGHT" WAS ANOTHER SPECIAL EVENING WHEN I HAD THE CHILDREN WHILE TO OTHERS WERE OUT FOR A MOVIE. (At least two adults always stay home with the children!) I told the children just as they woke from nap of the surprise-idea that they must come to dinner dressed like cowboys! It only takes a few kerchiefs around the neck & rubber boots on the feet to make an quick impromptu cowboy! We ate right out of the pot our "fireside" dinner of Chili con Carne, sitting all together out on the lonesome range (living room floor) with our stickhorse steeds (brooms) tied nearby at the door. Thank God we'd brought our kazoo, triangle & harmonica along in our "saddle bags", 'cause afterwards we learned a few cowboy songs by the fireside! -- I think our kids make the sweetest cowboys in the whole World!
