## Notes & Comments on Using This Index

This Index, covering Chapters 1 to 84 of the "Davidito Letters", has been especially written for busy parents and others involved in the care and training of children. Itself inference has beside it a time-saving note, summary or comment about the specific contents of the paragraph(s) referred to. We hope that this added annotation will make it much easier for you to find special topics or items of interest quickly, as well as see at a plane a simple summary or outline of the principle thoughts and ideas covered under each topic. Further to this, we have added where possible, special cross-referencing so that you will be able to look up related topics which are covered elsewhere in the Index.

It is important to note that all of the references used in this Index are made to bavidito Chapter numbers, and not yother numberings used on the letter, with the sception of the Father David Letter 60S, which we have referred to as ML608. Except where we have especially grouped topical references according to the ago of the child, all where we have leading to the control of the control of the control of the child, all references appear in numerical order, the chapter number first, followed by the paragraph for the control of the cont

numbers.

For example, under the heading "Davidito": 1:191 (love gift to David) — would mean that in the Davidito Story, Chapter 1, paragraph 191, you would find information to the effect that Daviditio was a love gift to David.

Topics which may be of greater interest to the reader have been printed in bold upper case lettering. Occasional abbreviations have been used. For example, where a section may have been added to the end of a letter, we have chosen to refer to this addition as a "footnote", abbreviated: "f/n". Where a small introduction has been written before the numbered paragraphs, we have chosen to refer to this section as "introduction", abbreviated: "first".

In the instance where duplicate numbering has occured, for example: "Whooping Cough and Childhood Diseases" and "El Canario" are both numbered Chapter 27, we have chosen to refer to "Whooping Cough" as Chapter 27, and "El Canario" as Chapter 27A.

Until the letters can be reprinted, the Reader needs to note the following printing errors that could cause confusion:

\* There are two Chapter 27's, which have been treated in this Index as "27" and "27A".

\*The two paragraphs "9" in Chapter 47 are treated as "9" and "9a". In Chapter 7, the paragraphs are numbered correctly up to 19, and then begin again at 11 to 22. We have simply re-numbered these paragraphs correctly, 20 to 31, and ask the Reader to do the same in his or her copy.
